Summary of Allegation(s)/Investigation:

The Department received two reports the deceased child's mother had called 911 needing Emergency Medical Services (EMS) due to the deceased child not breathing. Deceased child's mother provided different accounts as to what she was doing prior to the deceased child falling off the bed. Fire department and EMS began life-saving measures on the child until she was transferred to the hospital. One report also indicated EMS noted the child had one bluish-black bruise on the right forehead and two other bluish-black bruises on the top of the head on the upper right side, all about the size of a penny.

The Department determined the deceased child's mother was alone with her 3-month-old twins when the deceased child became unresponsive. Upon evaluation at the hospital, it was discovered the child had bilateral subdural hemorrhages and diffuse hypoxic brain injury. The deceased child's father stated he has observed the mother being "rough" with the babies on multiple occasions and his family had also observed similar behaviors and had even recorded her cursing at the children while the children were heard screaming. It was also found the deceased child's mother spent most of the time with the twins, and she reportedly would not allow anyone to care for them. Medical staff indicated these injuries would not occur spontaneously in a previously healthy infant nor because of normal infant handling. At the time the deceased child became unresponsive, the deceased child's mother was the only caregiver. The deceased child's father had left the home to pick up his paycheck.

Per the medical professionals, the deceased child's injuries typically occur as the result of forceful, violent acceleration-deceleration and/or torsional forces to the head and would not be the result of a simple fall off a bed or

caused by the deceased child's 18-month-old sibling, as reported by the deceased child's mother. The deceased child's twin sibling was also evaluated and had severe injuries requiring hospitalization, which were determined to be from physical abuse. The deceased child's twin sibling had 9 fractures in her legs, ankles, and knees, a buckle fracture of her wrist, rib fractures, and bruising to her face. The deceased child's oldest sibling also had some bruising, but no injuries could be ruled as abuse or neglect. Although life-saving treatment was provided to the child, she was pronounced brain dead on 3/15/2024.

The medical examiner completed an autopsy, but the final cause and manner of death were not available when the Department's investigation closed.

Law enforcement conducted an investigation that was still ongoing when the Department closed its investigation, however they had arrested the deceased child's mother on charges for injury to a child.

Investigation Findings:

The Department confirmed the deceased child's mother committed physical abuse of the deceased child, which resulted in her death.

The Department confirmed the deceased child's mother committed physical abuse of the deceased child's twin sibling.

The Department confirmed the deceased child's father committed neglectful supervision of the deceased child and her twin sibling.

The Department did not confirm the deceased child's mother committed neglectful supervision of the deceased child but did confirm physical abuse.

Previous Report of Abuse/Neglect:

Intake Date(s): 9/16/2022

Summary of Previous Allegation(s)/Investigation:

The Department received a report stating that the deceased child's mother gave birth to the child's older sibling. There were concerns the mother had tested positive for marijuana at birth and throughout her pregnancy even though the sibling was negative on urine screen at birth. The sibling's meconium test was sent off and results were pending.

The Department determined that the mother admitted to taking cannabidiol (CBD) gummies but denied smoking marijuana, even though she was positive for Tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) at the time of the siblings delivery and throughout her pregnancy for THC. The meconium results were not obtained so it was unknown if the sibling tested positive for any substances. The family was residing with paternal relatives who were providing support and the home was observed to be clean and the mother and father had an appropriate sleeping environment for the sibling. The mother also began taking child development classes to help her learn how to care for the sibling as this was her first child.

Investigation Findings:

The Department confirmed the mother committed neglectful supervision of the child's older sibling.
