Circumstances Surrounding Death

On January 5, 2022, the 6-year-old passed away after being struck by a vehicle after wandering away from the home.

According to the family, the following information was provided.

On January 5, 2022, in the early morning hours, the mother and father were in a verbal altercation. The mother denied that the argument turned physical but indicated arguments have turned physical in the past. The mother initially stated that she left the residence to get away from the father to calm down and that he was still at the home when she left. The mother later disclosed at Winter Haven Hospital that the father had left the home to go to a gas station, she knew the children were asleep, so she went on a walk. It is believed that the child heard the mother leave the home and left the home to look for her mother. The child was then seen at the intersection of Highway 92 and State Road 544 in Auburndale. An officer with the Auburndale Police Department saw the child and went to complete a U-turn to tend to the child, butbefore he could complete the turn to get back to where the child was located, the child ran into the street and was struck by a pick-up truck. Emergency Medical Services responded to the scene and transported the child to Winter Haven Hospital.

On January 5, 2022, Ra'nesha Jackson was pronounced deceased at 6:35 a.m.

The mother tested positive for Cocaine and THC upon arrival at the Emergency Room.

The father completed a drug screen and was negative for all substances.

The Auburndale Police Department investigated the death of Ra'nesha Jackson. (22-32). No arrests were made, nor charges filed.

On January 6, 2022, District 10 Medical Examiner Vera V. Volnikh, M.D., completed an autopsy of Ra'nesha Jackson. ME# 22-10-FA-007.


Cause of Death: Blunt Impact to Head Pedestrian Vs. Motor Vehicle Collision

On August 21, 2022, the Department of Children and Families' investigation was closed with:

- Verified Findings of Death and Inadequate Supervision as to Ra'nesha Jackson, with Tracey Wilson and Craig Jackson as the caregivers responsible.
- Not Substantiated Findings of Substance Misuse Illicit Drugs as to Ra'nesha,
- Verified Findings of Household Violence Threatens Child as to Ra'nesha, with Tracey Wilson and Craig Jackson as the caregivers responsible.

Summary of Current Agency Involvement with Family

At the time of the incident, there was no active child welfare involvement.

Summary of Prior Agency Involvement with Family

Between 2008 and 2021, there have been 11 reports involving the family with a pattern of concerns for substance abuse and domestic violence.

An April 2021 report was also closed with verified findings of substance exposed newborn to the youngest sibling, and substance misuse-illicit drugs to the remaining four children, when the mother and newborn infant tested positive for marijuana and cocaine. The family was referred to Neighbor to Families, Healthy Start and Tri-County for ongoing services.
