[REDACTED] (2) lived with his mother ([REDACTED] 34), in [REDACTED] County. [REDACTED] also has two other children in the home, [REDACTED] (11) and [REDACTED] (14). No one else is known to live in the home.

-Are you requesting immediate assistance from DCS to your location, or only an immediate phone call?

No, but the reporter is requesting that DCS go out to the home to ensure that there aren't any issues.

-Please provide a brief summary of the concerns and why DCS is needed to respond immediately.

On 3-20-23, the Medical Examiner's office (unknown personnel) contacted the Major Crimes Division with the [REDACTED] Police Department in reference to a deceased child. It is assumed that personnel at [REDACTED] Hospital (unknown personnel) initially contacted the Medical Examiner. Reportedly, [REDACTED] was attempting to take [REDACTED] to the hospital in her own vehicle, due to [REDACTED] having an asthma attack. [REDACTED] was pronounced deceased at the hospital (unknown time). Local police received the call from Major Crimes at 7:01 am and Major Crimes had been contacted at 6:30am. The time that [REDACTED] left the home with [REDACTED] is unknown. Once Major Crimes called [REDACTED] Police, officers (unknown) went to the family home and secured the scene. Major Crimes took photos before the home was released back to [REDACTED]. No concerns were noted with the home environment. Detective [REDACTED] with Major Crimes is handling this matter (ca [REDACTED] phone [REDACTED]). At this time, the child death is being treated as a "DOA undetermined." There were no signs of abuse or trauma. [REDACTED] body is currently at [REDACTED] Hospital. An autopsy will be completed to make sure that there was no foul play. If there are findings to support foul play, the matter will be investigated as such. Currently, no other details regarding this incident are known including why the mother attempted to transport the child instead of contacting emergency services. [REDACTED] was last known to be at her residence with unknown family members. It is assumed that the older two children were at the home with family members when Ms. [REDACTED] was transporting [REDACTED] to the hospital. No issues are known related to drug/alcohol, domestic violence or mental health. The reporter is also unaware of any previous instances of child fatality or serious injuries related to this family.

Additional info provided by CM [REDACTED]:

I Spoke with the officer who called it in. He reported that he called in in per their protocol, but noted that the series of events happened backwards, as typically they would have been called first, but the child was already at the ME's office instead. He stated that he was called as patrol to secure the scene after the Me's office had contacted major crimes saying that the child was there. He stated that he did not enter the home, but was only there to secure it until Inv. [REDACTED] and Major crimes could arrive. He stated that when they arrived, major crimes took over and did their part inside the home and took photos and the property was released back to the mother. He stated that there is a fire hall down the street from the family home and he is not sure why the mother didn't call 911 but his understanding is that the child was already deceased upon arrival to the hospital.

When I spoke with Det. [REDACTED] she reported no concerns with the family home and stated that she had observed the child with no trauma. She reports that there are two other children in the home, but the father had taken them to another residence to keep them away from all the chaos at the scene. She stated that the parents had reported being out of town in [REDACTED] for the father's birthday Thursday-Saturday and returned back Sunday and retrieved the child. She stated that the parents reported that all day yesterday (Sunday) was fine, no indication that he was sick or that anything was wrong. The mother reports that the child does have severe Asthma and takes breathing treatments everyday and that she also gives him 5mg of melatonin at night to sleep. She stated that the child does sleep in the bed with her and that they went to sleep around 10 pm last night. The mother reported that around 4 am, she awoke and the child was cold next her. She rushed the child to the emergency room. He was DOA. They arrived to the Emergency room at 4:30. Inv. [REDACTED] stated that the mother is home now and the home has been released at this time. She reports that the child is currently already at the ME's office and she is awaiting the exam. She has not current concerns of foul play, but once the exam is completed, if there is any other indication, then it will be investigated as such. As of now, no current concerns as she noted that she has observed the child and there did not appear to be any trauma to his person. I have texted her to see if she gathered information on the pediatrician to check on the Asthma, but no response back at this time.

On March 20, 2023, the Department of Childrens Services (DCS) received a referral for an allegation of Abuse Death. The Alleged Child Victim (ACV) was identified as [REDACTED] (deceased, aged 2), and the Alleged Perpetrator (AP) was initially identified as Unknown. Birth Mother, [REDACTED] and Birth Father, [REDACTED] were later added as Alleged Perpetrators for Abuse Death to [REDACTED]. Allegations of Drug Exposed Child (DEC) were also added for Alleged Child Victim (ACV) [REDACTED] (14) Alleged Child Victim (ACV) [REDACTED] (11), with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] listed as the Alleged Perpetrators. This investigation was assigned to Case Manager (CM) [REDACTED]. This case was worked in conjunction with [REDACTED] Police Department ([REDACTED] PD) Homicide Unit, with Lead Detective [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] (deceased, aged 2), lived in the home with biological parents, Ms. [REDACTED] and Mr. [REDACTED] and his half-siblings [REDACTED] (14) and [REDACTED] (11).

On March 20, 2023, the Medical Examiners office contacted [REDACTED] Police Department ([REDACTED] PD) due to the death of [REDACTED]. Reportedly, [REDACTED] was transported to [REDACTED] Hospital Emergency Room by his parents, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. Ms. [REDACTED] reported to the hospital that she had been sleeping in the same bed as [REDACTED] and that she woke up to find him cold to the touch. Ms. [REDACTED] reported that [REDACTED] had asthma. Medical personnel attempted Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) on [REDACTED] however he was declared deceased on March 20, 2023 at an unknown time.

On March 20, 2023, Case Manager (CM) [REDACTED] spoke with Sergeant (Sgt.) [REDACTED] from the [REDACTED] Police Department Homicide Unit. Sgt. [REDACTED] reported that the urine drug screen on (ACV) [REDACTED] was received and was positive for cocaine and fentanyl.

On March 20, 2023 CM [REDACTED] met with parents [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] at the family home. [REDACTED] stated that on March 15, 2023 she and Mr. [REDACTED] went to [REDACTED] Florida in order to celebrate

Mr. [REDACTED] birthday. (ACV) [REDACTED] and (ACV) [REDACTED] (11) stayed with their biological father, Mr. [REDACTED] and (ACV) [REDACTED] stayed with his paternal aunt, [REDACTED], during this time. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she and Mr. [REDACTED] returned to Tennessee late in the evening of March 18, 2023, and that she picked up all three children on Sunday, March 19, 2023, around 12:00 PM. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she and [REDACTED] went to bed at approximately 9:30 PM on March 19, 2023. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she regularly sleeps with [REDACTED] in her bed. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she woke up around 3:30 AM or 4:00 AM on March 20, 2023, and that [REDACTED] was cold to the touch. She woke up Mr. [REDACTED] who was sleeping on the couch, and that the two of them drove [REDACTED] to the [REDACTED] Hospital Emergency Room. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] was diagnosed with asthma and had been prescribed two different types of breathing treatments Albuterol and Budesonide and was supposed to have breathing treatments as needed for asthma attacks. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she did not give [REDACTED] breathing treatments every day and she had not given [REDACTED] a breathing treatment prior to going to bed on March 19, 2023. Ms. [REDACTED] consented to a urine drug screen (UDS) and was positive for THC and Benzodiazepine. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she did use CBD products while in [REDACTED] but denied the regular use of any THC products. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she has several prescriptions and that one of them may have caused a positive Benzodiazepine screen. Ms. [REDACTED] then stated that she had taken half a Xanax earlier in the day of March 20, 2023 that was non-prescribed. Mr. [REDACTED] consented to a UDS and was positive for THC and Fentanyl. Mr. [REDACTED] stated that he used THC during his trip to [REDACTED]. Mr. [REDACTED] stated that he takes non-prescribed Percocet pills daily.

On March 20, 2023, CM [REDACTED] and Detective [REDACTED] interviewed (ACV) [REDACTED] (14) at the family home. [REDACTED] stated that there are no drugs in her home and that she has never seen anyone do drugs.

On March 20, 2023, CM [REDACTED] and Detective [REDACTED] interviewed (ACV) [REDACTED] (11) at the family home. [REDACTED] stated that no one in his home does drugs or takes any medicine that makes them act funny.

On March 23, 2023, CM [REDACTED] spoke with Detective [REDACTED] on the phone. Detective [REDACTED] stated that during the search of the family home on March 20, 2023, Law Enforcement (LE) found 110 Fentanyl pills, 124 grams of cocaine, and unknown amount of marijuana, and a pill press in a fridge in the backyard of the family home. Detective [REDACTED] stated that he also completed a search of the cell phones of the family and found text messages between [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] regarding powder in the home. Detective [REDACTED] stated that the messages informed Ms. [REDACTED] to ask [REDACTED] where the powder was. Det. [REDACTED] stated that it is presumed that [REDACTED] refers to (ACV) [REDACTED]. On April 10, 2023, hair follicle results for [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were received and both children were positive for Fentanyl.

On March 20, 2023, an autopsy was performed on [REDACTED] (ACV) by [REDACTED], MD of the [REDACTED] County Medical Examiners Office. The autopsy reported that there was no significant acute inflammation of the lungs. The autopsy reported that the toxicology screen done at the time of autopsy found a lethal amount of Fentanyl (25 ng/mL), as well as the metabolites Norfentanyl and 4-ANPP. Also present was Xylazine (18 ng/mL) and Acetyl Fentanyl (0.33 ng/mL). The cause of death was listed as Fentanyl Overdose and the manner of death was listed as Accident.

On April 26, 2023 CM [REDACTED] spoke with Detective [REDACTED] on the phone. Detective [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were arrested on April 25, 2023 and were charged with premeditated 1st degree murder; felony murder; aggravated child abuse or neglect; and 2 counts of misdemeanor child endangerment.

CM [REDACTED] Team Leader (TL) [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Police Department (PD) Detective [REDACTED], Juvenile Court [REDACTED], and Assistant District Attorney (ADA) [REDACTED] were all in attendance. The team was in agreement that there was a preponderance of evidence to substantiate the allegations of Drug Exposed Child in regards to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] by [REDACTED] and [REDACTED].

Per DCS Policy Work Aid 1 Section G:

Child Death is defined as:

- a) Any child death caused by abuse or neglect.
- b) Any unexplained death of a child when the cause of death is unknown or pending an autopsy report.
- c) Any child death caused by abuse or neglect resulting from the parent or legal custodian/caretaker failure to stop another persons direct action that resulted in the death of the child. Child deaths are always treated as severe abuse.

Per DCS Policy Work Aid 1 Section B:

Drug Exposed Child is defined as:

This allegation pertains to a person under the age of eighteen (18) who:

Has been exposed to or experiencing withdrawal from use, sale, or manufacture of a drug or chemical substance (including, but not limited to alcohol such as a diagnosis of Fetal Alcohol Syndrome, cannabis, hallucinogens, stimulants, sedatives, narcotics, methamphetamines, heroin, inhalants) that could adversely affect the child's physical, mental, or emotional functioning as a result of the actions or behaviors of the parent/caregiver; or

Has a parent/caregiver that uses drugs or chemical substances that impacts their ability to adequately care for the child; or

Has a parent/caregiver that has current addiction issues that could adversely affect the child's physical, mental, or emotional functioning. Drug Exposed Child (Severe) Severe forms of this allegation include but is not limited to:

♦ The manufacturing of methamphetamine where children are present, or in close proximity.

♦ Infants born with a diagnosis of Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD);

♦ Infants born with a diagnosis of Neo-Natal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS) where the diagnosis is not based on the mother's prescribed and appropriately followed Medication-Assisted Treatment.

♦ Knowingly or with gross negligence allowing a child under eight (8) years of age to ingest an illegal substance or a controlled substance that results in the child testing positive on a drug screen, except as legally prescribed to the child; and/or

♦ Knowingly allowing a child to be within a structure where a Schedule I controlled substance under TCA 39-17-406, cocaine, methamphetamine and/or fentanyl are present and accessible by the child.

During the course of the investigation, the siblings ACV [REDACTED] (14) and ACV [REDACTED] (11) were placed via an Immediate Protection Agreement (IPA) with their biological father, Mr. [REDACTED]. Mr. [REDACTED] filed a petition with [REDACTED] County Juvenile Court on April 5, 2023, and was granted emergency custody of both children. On April 10, 2023, hair follicle results for [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were received and both children were positive for Fentanyl. The Department filed an intervening restraining order to ensure there is supervised-

The Abuse Death investigation regarding Alleged Child Victim (ACV) [REDACTED] was debriefed with Case Managers (CM) [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] and Team Leader (TL) [REDACTED]. Also present was Team Coordinator (TC) [REDACTED], CPS Director (CPSD) [REDACTED], and Director of Critical Incident Support (DCIS) [REDACTED].

The CPS investigation was assigned on 3/20/23 concerning the death of ACV [REDACTED] (2yo). It was reported [REDACTED] resided with his birth mother [REDACTED] birth father [REDACTED] and two half-siblings [REDACTED] 11yo and [REDACTED] 14yo in [REDACTED] County.

On the morning of 3/20/23 the parents presented [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] ER via private vehicle, and he was pronounced deceased upon arrival. The mother reported co-sleeping with [REDACTED] the previous evening and waking between 3:30-4am at which time she discovered [REDACTED] was cold to the touch and unresponsive. [REDACTED] was reported to have asthma as well prescriptions to treat as needed. There were no observable injuries or neglect to the body. Urinalysis later revealed [REDACTED] was positive for cocaine and fentanyl. Autopsy and official toxicology results are pending.

The parents reported they were recently on vacation for the fathers birthday, leaving on 3/15/23 and returning the evening/morning of 3/18/23 and 3/19/23. The children were left with relatives during this time; with [REDACTED] staying with a paternal aunt and the older siblings with their birth father. The parents picked up the children around noon on 3/19/23. They reported no concerns for [REDACTED] at that time and he appeared to be behaving normally and in good health. The mother reported going to bed at usual time [9:30-10pm] that evening with [REDACTED] sleeping with her in the bed and the father on the couch, as was routine. The mother reported they normally woke up around 7:30am, but that morning she woke early [3:30-4am] and found [REDACTED] unresponsive. The other children were present in the home sleeping in their rooms.

Upon the urinalysis results LE conducted a search warrant on the home. Marijuana roaches were observed in the kitchen and living room in plain sight. It is unknown at this time if other drugs were found. The parents both

consented to urine drug screens. The mother was positive for THC and benzodiazepines. While the mother did have some prescriptions she had none that would test positive for benzodiazepine and eventually admitted following the death of [REDACTED] she was given half a Xanax by a friend. The father tested positive for THC and fentanyl. He reported taking non-prescribed Percocet daily, last doing so on 3/18/23. The parents denied regular THC use but stated they used marijuana and CBD products while on vacation in [REDACTED] and away from the children. At this time LE has not shared the positive cocaine and fentanyl results with the parents regarding [REDACTED] as they are awaiting the official toxicology results. The search warrant also included testing for clothes and bedding as well as cell phone records for the parents. The parents admitted to smoking cigarettes regularly in the home despite [REDACTED] and the fathers asthma issues.

An IPA was completed for the surviving siblings to stay in their fathers care while the investigation continues at this time. The mother agreed to supervised contact and the father of [REDACTED] to no contact within the IPA. Expedited and home walkthrough were approved for the siblings father.

- CM will present findings to the Child Protective Investigative Team (CPIT) for classification review.

Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she has some prescriptions that may have caused the positive screen for BZO. CPSI conducted a pill count of all of Ms. [REDACTED] prescriptions and documented them on the pill count log. After staffing with on-call TL [REDACTED] it was determined that none of the prescriptions should have caused a positive result for BZO. CM explained to Ms. [REDACTED] that BZO is a prescription level anxiety medication that is often referred to by the brand name Xanax. Ms. [REDACTED] then stated that she did take half a Xanax pill that was given to her by a friend after [REDACTED] died. Mr. [REDACTED] consented to a UDS which was administered by Detective [REDACTED] in the family home. Mr. [REDACTED] was positive for THC and Fentanyl. [REDACTED] stated that there are no drugs in her home and that she has never seen anyone do drugs. [REDACTED] stated that she does feel safe at home. CM [REDACTED] interviewed ACV [REDACTED] (11) privately in Ms. [REDACTED] bedroom. Detective [REDACTED] was present for this interview as well. [REDACTED] stated that no one in his home does drugs or takes any medicine that makes them act funny. [REDACTED] stated that he felt safe at home.

On April 14th, 2023 CM [REDACTED] received the results of the autopsy on ACV [REDACTED] (deceased, aged 2) which was preformed on March 20th, 2023. The autopsy reported that there was "no significant acute inflammation" of the lungs. The autopsy reported that the toxicology screen done at the time of autopsy found a lethal amount of Fentanyl (25 ng/mL), as well as the metabolites Norfentanyl and 4-ANPP. Also present was Xylazine (18 ng/mL) and Acetyl Fentanyl (0.33 ng/mL). The cause of death was listed as Fentanyl Overdose and the manner of death was listed as Accident.

On March 20th, 2023 CM [REDACTED] responded to the family home ([REDACTED]) with Law Enforcement (LE).
